#### Vehicle Concerns

Fuel Shut Off Switch: The following potential condition may occur on all Ford Crown Victoria's. The fuel pump shut-off switch may cause the engine to stop. If this condition occurs, the vehicle must be stopped immediately. As a result of this device triggering the power steering will become stiffer and the braking system will have enough reserve for 1-2 braking applications (under power) before the brake pedal becomes harder to apply.

Once the vehicle is stopped, there is a reset procedure in the "Owner's Guide" under Roadside Emergencies, page 95. The switch can be located on the left hand side of the trunk interior and is clearly marked with a yellow/black sticker.

Note: The reset button may be triggered from a rear side impact → simply reset button.

Radio Interference: Interference affecting radio transmission may occur on some cruisers equipped with rear deck strobe lights. RTT or Emergency signal transmission from the radio or repeater may not be received by a Comm Centre with the rear strobe lights activated. This problem is caused by a combination of factors, location and activated rear deck strobe lights, when the mobile is located beyond approx. 50% of the towers communication range. Officer/public safety is paramount. Please consider your ability to transmit via radio in all circumstances as well as visibility (visual warning to motorist) when activating rear deck strobe lights. Transport section is working to resolve this issue.


