



# CORPORATE SERVICES CONFIDENTIAL INTERNAL BRIEFING REPORT

#### ISSUE:

It came to the attention of Career Development Bureau - Recruitment Section, that members from Peterborough Detachment had concerns about Michael JACK, a candidate in our recruitment process.

#### BACKGROUND:

JACK was interviewed for Constable on 29 May 08 by Sgt's Haennel and Whitney. He was recommended for background investigation. They noted JACK appeared very proud of his accomplishments and somewhat rigid. They felt his high level of intelligence could be mistaken as being socially awkward.

On or about 05 Aug 08, Insp. Thomas was notified by a member of Peterborough Detachment, they had concerns about JACK because he had gone to the detachment prior to his start date and during a ride along, appeared overly enthusiastic about his gun collection to the extent he took several members to his home and showed them the collection.

A complete background and psyc evaluation had already been completed in the course of the recruitment process with no concerns raised.

Another investigation was subsequently initiated.

#### Summary of Follow up Investigation:

Sgt. Whitney spoke with two of his references, a Professor Brian Patrick who is the head of the Computer Program at Trent University. He advises that he has been to JACK's residence and seen the guns. They are all collectors' weapons that he has carefully collected and he is very proud of his collection. This is the reason that he shows them off. In no way does he feel that he is "gun happy". He sets his eyes on a specific gun to add to his collection only and many are vintage WWII guns. They are all registered and stored properly.

Sgt. Whitney spoke with Andre Melaney who is JACK's landlord. He advises that he has seen the guns and has been with him when he attended the local gun club which he belongs to and actually shot many of these guns. He also advises they are all stored in a special safe and he is not concerned in any way with JACK having these in his household.

Melaney feels JACK is very proud of the collection and doesn't just show them to anyone. He would not describe him as "gun happy" just a proud collector.

JACK also contacted Sgt. Whitney as he had heard that we were contacting some of his references. He was advised that this was an issue that was not fully pursued during his background investigation. He advised that he had attended the detachment to meet the people he was going to be working with and had gone on ride alongs with two officers. The two officers were Cst. John Pollock and Cst. Mark Gravelle who were both invited to his residence to see this collection. He advised that he does follow the rules in regards to firearms.

CPIC checks were conducted and all firearms are registered and clear.

11Aug08-	Dr. Lapalme aware of situation.
15Aug08-	Sgt. Haennel discussed situation with Dr. Lapalme who agreed to interview JACK during PRE Recruit week in Orillia. (25-29Aug08) Sgt. Haennel notified Sgt. Rathbun of Peterborough
	Detachment of same.
25Aug08-	Dr. Lapalme interviews JACK during the PRE Recruit course and has no concerns.

Sgt. Haennel notifies Sgt. Rathbun about the outcome of the 04Se08-No other known concerns at this time.

#### CONCLUSION:

Upon further investigation and the interview by Dr. Lapalme, no evidence of a concern could be found.

Sgt's Haennel and Whitney noted the following about JACK;

Socialized outside of Canada

Raised in a culture of pride

Performed mandatory Military time in his country of origin

Very driven and motivated

Very high level of intelligence

Some evidence of awkwardness relating to Canadian social cues

Based on these observations, it is the opinion of Haennel and Whitney that JACK is experiencing some awkwardness as he begins to socialize himself into the police culture.

#### Complainant - Martin Graham:

He was the Sergeant Major that received information about Jack and the photograph.

#### Witness - Shaun Filman:

He was Jack's coach officer. He observed the photograph and asked Jack about it.

#### Witness - Jamie Brockley

He was a drug investigator, now assigned to Peterborough County Detachment. He observed the photograph and recognized Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras. He knows these three persons to be undesirables.

#### Witness - Rob Flindall

He was the Sergeant at Peterborough County Detachment, he gathered the information from Filman and Brockley and alerted his supervisors.

#### Undesirable Person - George Tzavaras

(Not spoken to in this investigation) He has a criminal record for violence and is believed to be involved in drug trafficking. He worked out at Good Life Fitness Centre in 2003.

#### Undesirable Person - Elvis Agim Karaj

(Not spoken to in this investigation) He has a criminal record for violence and theft. He is believed to be involved in drug trafficking. He worked out at Good Life Fitness Centre in 2003.

#### Undesirable Person - David James Edwardes-Evans

(Not spoken to in this investigation) He has a criminal record for theft. He is believed to be involved in drug trafficking and drug importation. He worked out at Good Life Fitness Centre in 2003. He received a rifle scope in the USA and brought it to Canada for Jack.

#### Summary of Statement of Respondent Officer - Constable Michael Jack:

Jack posed in a photograph with Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras. Jack brought the photograph into the detachment and showed it around.

#### Referenced Information:

Police Services Act Ont. Reg 23/198 "Code of Conduct" Sec 2 (1)(a)(xi)

#### Investigation:

On August 25, 2008, Provincial Constable Michael Jack was hired by the Ontario Provincial Police. He was assigned to Peterborough County Detachment as his first posting. Peterborough has been his home for the last ten years. His coach officer was Provincial Constable Shaun Filman.

Shortly after Jack arrived at Peterborough Detachment in January 2009, he met Brockley. Bockley wrote in his duty report that Jack was interested in drugs as a line of police work and told him that he knew Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras from his time at the gym. Jack also said that he had a photograph of them. Jack told Brockley that Edwardes-Evans brought him back a rifle scope from the United States. The next day Jack produced a photograph of himself and Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras at Good Life Fitness Gym in Peterborough. PC Brockley and Filman viewed the photograph. Brockley observed 8-10 people in the photograph and recognized Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras, as well as Jack. Brockley advised Jack that Karaj and Tzavaras were involved in the drug trade. Jack told him that he didn't know what they did, but they always seemed to have a lot of money.

Jack advised Filman that he was unaware until recently that Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras had a known and substantial criminal history. Jack told Filman that he knew them from the gym and it was not a close relationship. Filman wrote in his duty report that "Michael Jack indicated that he had known that David James Edwardes-Evans traveled to the United States on occasion and had gotten him to purchase and return a rifle scope to him. He further explained that due to the fact that the relationship was not a close one it had taken him some time for this to occur and in fact Edwardes-Evans had re-approached him months after the original request to say he could do it on an upcoming trip". Jack told Filman that these people do not know that he is an OPP officer and this may be of benefit in a possible undercover operation.

Filman wrote in his duty report that "Sometime later Michael Jack was assigned to attend court and fingerprint some persons in custody. One of the persons in custody turned out to be Edwardes-Evans. I was present when the fingerprinting took place and I did observe Edwardes-Evans see Michael Jack and have a perplexed look on his face and acknowledge to Michael Jack that he was now a police officer. Edwardes-Evans did not appear to have a close relationship with Michael Jack or have knowledge that he was a police officer".

Brockley wrote in his duty report "I was not concerned nor did I see it necessary at the time to make a notation in my notebook on the photograph". Filman wrote in his duty report "It was my interpretation that Michael Jack had come to associate with these people based on a common interest in body building and a common place to participate in this activity".

On July 31<sup>st</sup> 2009, Jack queried a licence plate through the Smiths Falls Communication Centre. The plate was registered to ARI Financial which is a company used by the Ontario Provincial Police to disguise vehicles operated by the Ontario Provincial Police. Jack stated that he had no recollection of running the licence plate and made no notes regarding the plate.

Sgt Flindall was advised of the photograph and the licence plate query in relation to Jack. He advised his supervisors.

On September 22<sup>nd</sup> 2009, Professional Standards reviewed the logger tape for July 31<sup>st</sup> 2009. The tape revealed that Jack stopped a vehicle on the side of the road, he ran the proper marker. The Communications Centre mistakenly replaced Z with X in the marker and provided the ARI Financial details. It was Jack that identified the ARI Financial vehicle as being the wrong vehicle and asked for the plate to be checked a second time. The dispatcher acknowledged the mistake as hers and provided the proper details.

On October 30<sup>th</sup> 2009, Detective Sergeant Thompson interviewed Jack in relation to his association with Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras. Jack advised that in 2003 he worked out at Good Life gym for a four month period. It was at this time that he met Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras. He only ever saw Karaj and Tzavaras at the gym and has not seen them since. He did not see Edwardes-Evans for a number of years after 2003.

In July 2008, Jack began seeing Edwardes-Evans at Gold's gym. At the gym, he told a friend that he wanted to buy a rifle scope in the United States, but they would not ship to Canada. Edwardes-Evans overheard this conversation and offered that if Jack had it shipped to Edwardes-Evans brother's place in Arizona, he could bring it back for Jack. They exchanged phone numbers. Edwardes-Evans phoned Jack and said he was going to the States. Jack purchased the rifle scope and had it shipped to Edwardes-Evans brother's residence. Edwardes-Evans picked up the scope, brought it back to Canada and gave it to Jack in the Gold's Gym parking lot in July or August 2008.

Jack turned the photograph over to Professional Standards. The stamp on the back of the picture had an 03 which indicated the photo was developed in 2003. The photo was

of several males at the gym posing for the photo. Jack pointed out Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras as well as a corrections officer in the picture.

Analysis

There is insufficient evidence to support the allegation that Michael Jack is associating with undesirables. The photograph was from 2003, five years before Jack ever became a member of the Ontario Provincial Police. Jack stated in his interview that he has not had any contact with them since becoming a police officer.

The ARI Financial vehicle information was a mistake made by the dispatcher. On the logger tape she was heard saying "10-4, I had an X where the Z is, stand by". It was Jack that pointed out the error to her. Jack did not make any notes of the ARI Financial plate, because he never queried it.

Jack's relationship with Edwardes-Evans, Karaj and Tzavaras was related to the gym and is minimal at best. Since Jack became an Ontario Provincial Police officer he has not associated with Edwardes-Evans, Karaj or Tzavaras.

Conclusion:

The allegation is unsubstantiated.
